1 INTRODUCTION

The Tariff & Trade Data (TTD) platform provides official tariff and import data for more than 150 economies, including annual data from 1996 onwards for many of them. It aggregates and disseminates official information about applied tariffs and import data notified by WTO Members in the WTO's Integrated Data Base (IDB) and bound duties (agreed maximum tariffs) and other commitments recorded in the WTO's Consolidated Tariff Schedules (CTS) database.

This information is complemented with information from the WTO Analytical Database (ADB), which integrates data from WTO sources, including Regional Trade Agreements (RTA), as well as data from external partners such as the International Trade Centre (ITC), UN Comtrade, and Trade Data Monitor (TDM). The ADB serves as the main source for platform statistics and is also available for download in raw format.

Tariff & Trade Data is currently in its beta version. As a result, some functionalities and pages may evolve, and additional features will be introduced over time. For questions or feedback, please contact us at ttd@wto.org.

This User Guide provides instructions on how to use each module of the platform. The TTD user interface offers simple navigation and intuitive selections. While most options are self-explanatory, this guide aims to assist users in handling more complex selections, understanding the results, and exploring the relationships between different sets of information.

The rest of this User Guide is organized according to the structure of the menu of the platform.





View applied tariffs and import statistics at the tariff line level available in the "Tariff Line Data/applied duties, as reported by WTO Members.


Steps to search:


- 1 Select an economy




Each profile consists of four sections: tariffs, import statistics, export statistics, and preferential tariff regimes.

The first section presents side-by-side aggregate statistical indicators for MFN applied and bound tariffs:

The second and third sections provide import and export data, respectively, highlighting the top 10 trading partners and the top 10 traded HS subheading products, along with their shares and values. Import data is primarily sourced from notifications to the IDB, while export data comes from UN Comtrade or Trade Data Monitor (TDM).





The fourth and final section of the profiles lists the various preferential trade regimes reported by and granted to the selected economy, including its preferential trading partners.

For example, in the screenshot below, the left side displays the preferential regimes provided by the European Union to its trading partners, while the right side shows the trade preferences granted to the European Union by other partners. These regimes include both non-reciprocal tariff preferences offered to other partners and reciprocal agreements that establish mutual tariff concessions between two parties.



4 REPORTS


The "Reports" section provides customized summary statistics that help users understand and analyse tariff and trade data. These reports allow users to:

- Compare tariff and trade patterns in bilateral trade between two economies.
- Analyse tariff changes over time.
- Examine trade patterns from both a product category and a trading partner perspective.

Additional reports will be added to support analysis from different angles.

4.1 Bilateral tariff and trade relations

This report analyses the bilateral tariff treatment and trade flows between Economy A and Economy B. It presents import values for both economies, providing insights into their trade balance, product composition, applied tariffs, and preferential trade regimes.



To begin, select Economy A and Economy B from the selection panels, then Apply the filter. The results are organized into four sections:

Trade Trends: This section visualizes the evolution of trade values between the selected economies over the past ten years, highlighting overall trade trends and trade balance changes.



Trade Structure by Product: This section provides a breakdown of bilateral trade flows between Economy A and Economy B by MTN product groups for the most recent year with available data. To enhance understanding, the arrow in the image below highlights the trade direction.


Tariff Rates: The third section presents information on the tariff rates applied between the selected economies. It includes both simple average and trade-weighted average tariff rates, covering all products as well as agricultural and non-agricultural goods imported between Economy A and Economy B.



Preferential Trade Agreements: The fourth section provides information on the preferential trade agreements granted by Economy A to Economy B and vice versa. This list is not exhaustive and is based on data reported to the WTO.

4.2 Time series

The **Time Series Report** provides data over multiple years presented in four different tabs:

- A. Overview A comprehensive view of trade-weighted applied tariffs and imports.
- B. Applied Duties Yearly data on MFN applied duties and preferential duty schemes.
- **C. Bound Duties** Information on bound tariff rates.
- **D. Imports** Import data trends over several decades.

The report includes data for all WTO Members and covers various product groups at different levels of disaggregation.

- MTN Sub-Categories The MTN categories are further broken down into 72 sub-categories, enabling a more detailed analysis of trade patterns.

The composition of EU Members within the European Union as an Economy varies across different years, reflecting changes in EU membership over time.


Customs offices record tariff and trade information according to the Harmonized System (HS). The HS is standardized up to six-digit level and customs offices generally have more detailed information, some national customs use 10- or 12-digit codes. In this report, except for the maximum duty, all statistics are first pre-aggregated to 6 digits; for tariffs the arithmetic average is calculated for each sub-heading while for imports the sum for the sub-heading is computed. Ad-valorem equivalents are calculated at the most detailed level whenever possible.

For this report, ① select a WTO Member in the drop-down window labelled as *Economy*, ② under *Product* choose a product group; once those two parameters are filled, the ③ *Apply filter* button turns green and it is possible to click on the *Apply Filter* button. The product group can be changed for the same economy and the data will appear once one has clicked on the *Apply filter* button. If one wants to analyse a different economy, then one should first click on *Clear filter* and then select an *Economy*, followed by the desired *Product* and *Apply filter*.

A. Overview

This tab shows the 4 trade weighted average of the MFN applied tariff and 5 best preference for the latest available 5 years. The Best preference is the lowest duty from any preferential duty schemes offered by the market under analysis to the imports from a country which is a beneficiary of that duty scheme; if no preferential scheme is available to the product from a country, then the MFN duty is relevant. The best preference is the trade-weighted average, assuming full utilization of the best preferential scheme(s) at the subheading level.

The product group Total (All products) for imports include Unspecified products; notice that unspecified products are excluded from trade weighted averages.




B. Applied duties

This tab provides information on the applied Most Favored Nation (MFN) tariff and available preferential duty schemes across years. The user can:

- compare different duty schemes for one specific year; in that case the user will need to select one year in the drop-down window under *Year*,
- or analyse one specific duty scheme across years; in that case the user will need to select a *Duty scheme*

For all the available duty schemes, the simple average is provided; a * is listed next to the statistics whenever ad-valorem equivalents are used. In addition, for the MFN statutory duty, the trade weighted average based on imports from world and the maximum duty are available. All duty schemes for the available years can be downloaded in Excel format by clicking on *Download full data*.





Fully duty-free averages are listed in greyed font while dutiable averages are in full font. In the example above, duty scheme A1742, Pacific Agreement on Closer Economic Relations (PACER) Plus is fully duty free while duty scheme A4001 Australia- General System of Preferences (GSP) has an average of 0.09 per cent. Although the simple average for Duty scheme A1726 is listed as 0.00%, the average is not fully duty free; the simple average is 0.002 per cent and rounded to 0.00 per cent.

C. Bound duties

Under this tab, four different statistics are presented:

- 1. Binding coverage: share of sub-headings (6-digit HS code) in chapters 01 to 97 that are partially or fully bound.
- 2. Simple average: the arithmetic average of bound duties is first calculated at the sub-heading level and then aggregated at the level of the product group (all products, agricultural products or non-agricultural products).
- 3. Share of sub-headings that are fully duty-free; sub-headings containing both duty-free and dutiable commitments are dutiable at the sub-heading level. All the national tariff lines under a sub-heading should to be duty-free for the sub-heading to be considered as duty-free.

If AVEs are used in the calculation of the simple average or in determining the maximum duty, then a \ast will be listed next to the statistics. The maximum duty in the example below has a \ast ; the 55% is part of a subheading where there are non-ad valorem duties and is not necessarily represent an AVE.

Those statistics can be downloaded in Excel format by clicking on Download full data.




D: Imports

Imports for a market and a product group are provided as of 1996 where available. The data is sourced from different databases with the following order of priority: first the WTO Integrated database, secondly the UNSD Comtrade database and finally the Trade Data.

4.3 Imports & exports pattern




This report presents data on the import and export patterns of a selected economy for a chosen year.

The information is categorized into three product classifications:

- HS (Harmonized System)
- MTN (Multilateral Trade Negotiations)
- Selected product groups

Once a classification is selected, more detailed product categories can be chosen under "Product".



The first chart, "Top Partners," shows import and export values and percentage share by trading partner. The second chart, "Top Products," displays import and export values and percentage share by HS chapters, headings, and subheadings when the HS classification is selected. For other

classifications, it presents data by relevant product subcategories. The MTN sub-categories are organized by **Agricultural and Non-Agricultural products**, then subdivided into more detailed sub-categories. Trade information can also be displayed by predefined product groups (Selected Product Groups)

Chart1: Top Partners

On the right-hand side of the top importers' or exporters' values and percentage shares, you can click on the small blue icon \square to view detailed information about the most traded products between the selected economy and its partner.





Chart2: Top products


On the right-hand side of the top imported or exported product, you can click on the small blue icon to view information about the top partners for the product.



The full data related to the selected economy, year, and product can be downloaded using the button at the bottom of the webpage.




4.4 Tariff actions


The Tariff Actions dataset tracks changes to effectively applied tariff duties offering a detailed view of how import duties evolve over time. Effectively applied tariff rates are recorded at the tariff line level in the WTO's Integrated Database. These rates incorporate the Most Favoured Nation (MFN) applied duty and preferential tariff rates. Subsequently tariff actions are included, which may increase, decrease, or substitute a certain tariff level.

5.1 WTO Commitments (CTS)

The WTO Commitments (CTS) section provides an online version of a Member's Schedule of concessions on goods. However, this version does not have legal status and is not an exact reproduction of the official Schedule of concessions.

An introduction to the CTS, an overview of Members' Schedules, and a Glossary of key terminology used in the CTS database are available on the homepage of this section.







WTO COMMITMENTS (CTS) WTO Schedules of concessions, often referred to as "Good Schedules" are legal instruments that describe the treatment a member must provide to the trade in goods of other WTO members The WTO Consolidated Tariff Schedules (CTS) database contains all WTO members' concessions on goods in a standardized format. The CTS includes members' bound tariff commitments (base and final tariffs, other duties and charges, implementation periods, INRs) and specific agricultural commitments (domestic support, export subsidies, and tariff quota information) with the relevant legal document references. The original version of the CTS database was recorded in the HS 1996 nomenclature, but most members' commitments have now been successively transposed to HS 2002, HS 2007, HS 2012, and HS 2017 nomenclatures. The CTS database is readily accessible to WTO members, the public and authorized international organizations at the tariff line level. The WTO Secretariat has prepared several software tools to facilitate extracting and analysing information from the database For the members' latest approved HS version of CTS, please go to "Data availability» CTS - HS version of final bound tariffs". How to find the statistics: Please select "Member" and click "Apply". After selecting member, users can review up-to-date information on members' bound tariff commitments and specific agricultural commitments, organized by the structure of a Goods Schedule. Most-favoured-nation (MFN) tariffs (list of concessions, i.e. bound duty rates) Section I - Agricultural products Section 1A - Agricultural product tariffs Section 1B – Agricultural product tariff quotas Preferential tariffs (according to Article I of the General Agreement, if applicable)



To generate information for a specific economy, select an economy and click the Apply Filter button. In the example below, Afghanistan is selected.


The right panel displays general information about the selected economy's Schedule, including schedule number, HS version, WTO membership date, language of the Schedule and date of the last update.



In a major part of the screen, you will find the different Parts and Annexes as they appear in a Member's Schedule. Each Part may be further subdivided into Sections, where applicable.

By clicking on Part I - MFN Tariffs, you will access tabs containing information on: Section 1A – Bound duties for agricultural products, Section 1B – Tariff quotas, Section 2 – Bound duties for non-agricultural products and Section 1A – Agricultural Product Tariffs.

In Section 1A, you will find detailed tariff line information for agricultural products. Each tariff line includes the following details: Tariff Line HS Code, Tariff Line Suffix (TLS) – Used when multiple duties apply to the same HS code, Product Description, Final Bound Duty and Other Duties and Charges.



You can use filters to select products based on either the product description or the HS 2-digit chapter (e.g., 01, 02, etc.).


- When selecting an HS 2-digit chapter, you will have the option to refine your selection by choosing HS 4-digit headings.
- When selecting an HS 4-digit heading, you can further narrow down your selection to HS 6-digit subheadings.

In the example below, HS Chapter 04 and HS Heading 0407 have been selected.

To clear all filters, click Reset.

For more details, click **Show More** on the right. When selected, this option displays additional information at the tariff line level, including:

- **Tariff Line Description with Hierarchy** Shown on the left, presenting the full structure of the tariff nomenclature.
- Additional Information on the Right:
 - C Indicates the tariff line is certified, meaning it has been approved by all Members and is included in a legal instrument.
 - Accession Refers to the Accession Protocol, which specifies the type of legal instrument.
 - AFG/16 Represents the symbol of the present instrument, including the concession.
 - Other details (if available for the selected Member): First Instrument, Base Duty, Special Safeguard (SSG), Present and Earlier INRs, Implementation Period, Other Terms and Conditions. For example, this information is not available for Afghanistan under tariff line 01012100.

To view information on agricultural product tariff quotas, click on **Section 1B**. In this example, the selected economy is **Brazil**. Remember to click **"Apply Filter"** after selecting an economy.


Use the filters to select a specific tariff quota. For instance, select **BRAQ001 – Manzanas y Peras**.

Once a tariff quota is selected, the relevant details are displayed:

- On the Right Panel: Tariff Quota ID, Quantity Unit, Description, Initial Quantity, Source Refers to the type of document that includes the tariff quota. In this case, the tariff quota for "Manzanas y Peras" is included in the HS96 transposition certified document.
- **On the Left Panel:** Final Quantity, Status of certification, Implementation Period, Initial Negotiation Rights (INRs), Other Terms and Conditions for the specific tariff quota.


Below the **Filters**, you will find the individual tariff lines included in the **tariff quota BRAQ001 – Manzanas y Peras**.

This quota relates to two tariff lines: **08081000**, **08082001**. Each tariff line includes the following details: Tariff Line HS Code, Tariff Line Suffix (TLS), Tariff Quota ID (TQ ID), Description, Initial In-Quota Duty – 15%, Final In-Quota Duty – 13.5%, and Final Out-of-Quota Duty – 28.8%.

To see more details about the **out-of-quota tariff line**, click on **Full Quota**, which displays the product description and bound duty.

To access tariff line information for non-agricultural products, click on **Section 2**. In this example, select **Afghanistan** and click **Apply Filter**.


The displayed information includes Tariff Line HS Code, Tariff Line Suffix (TLS), Product Description, Final Bound Duty, and Other Duties and Charges.



Use **Filters** to select products according to the product description **OR** the HS 2-digit chapter (26, etc.)

When you select an HS chapter you have the possibility to select HS 4-digit headings and When you select HS 4-digit headers you can select HS 6-digit subheadings.

Below the selection is made for HS chapter 91 and HS heading 9101.



Click on **Reset** to remove all filters.

For more information click on **Show more** on the right.

When selected this option enables you to see additional information at the tariff line level such as:

C for certified meaning that the tariff line is approved by all Members and included in a legal instrument

Accession for Accession Protocol which is the type of legal instrument

AFG/16 the symbol of the Present instrument including the concession

Information on First instrument, Base duty, Special safeguard (SSG), Present and Earlier INRs, Implementation period and Other terms and conditions would also be provided if available for the Member selected. This not the case for Afghanistan for tariff line 91011100.





The WTO Integrated Database (IDB) contains WTO members' annual tariff and trade information notifications, linked at the tariff line level as of 1996. On the trade side, the IDB contains imports by country of origin, in value, by tariff line. On the tariff side, it contains MFN current applied duties and, if available, information covering preferential duties.

GLOSSARY

Integrated Database (IDB): WTO database of applied tariffs and imports

Harmonized System (HS): An international nomenclature developed by the World Customs Organization (WCO), which is arranged in sk-digit codes allowing all participating economies to classify traded goods on a common basis. Beyond the six-digit level, economies are free to introduce national distinctions for tariffs and many other purposes.

Developed by the WCO, it is organized in a hierarchical structure:

- Chapter (2 digits)
- Headings (4 digits)
- Sub-headings (6 digits)

Tariff line: The customs tariff line number (or HS code) associated with the product for which a concession is offered. Each entry in the database will have a number associated with it (including HS and tariff headings).

TLS: Refers to tariff line suffix which extends a narrowly defined tariff line's HS code to record two or more duties at different levels.

MFN (most-favoured-nation) tariff: Normal non-discriminatory tariff charged on imports (excludes preferential tariffs under free trade agreements and other schemes or tariffs charged within quotas)

This section consists of six core information elements:

- 1. **Applied tariffs by duty regime** (MFN and preferences) for a specific year applied by the economy.
- 2. **List of trade agreements** and corresponding partners.
- 3. Internal taxes and other charges, if available.
- 4. In-quota duty rates, if available.
- 5. **Import values** in millions of US dollars and share by partner.
- 6. **Final bound duties at the tariff line level**, concorded with the HS version to align applied tariffs with final bound tariffs.




